Subject: Enhancement in number of attempts to pass All India Trade Test (AITT) on Semester Pattern – regarding.

Sir/Madam

I am directed to refer to this office letter of even No. dated 18th November, 2013 on subject "Modified All India Trade Test (AITT) Procedure and marking scheme for all trades of Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) under semester pattern". Vide Para 5 of the above letter, failed trainees are given only 1 additional attempt to pass AITT on Semester pattern otherwise they had to take re-admission as ex-trainee in the same ITI(copy enclosed).

A large number of representations were received from Private ITI Associations and State Governments to review the above norms and to permit more number of chances to failed trainees to pass AITT on semester pattern.

Accordingly, it has now been decided that the trainees of ITIs will be given 5 attempts i.e. 1st attempt will be a regular attempt and 4 additional chances to failed trainees, to pass any semester examination of AITT within a period of 5 years from the year of appearing for the regular attempt of that semester. Only the failed trainees will also be promoted to next semesters and would be allowed to write examination of subsequent semesters also.

Trainees who were otherwise eligible i.e. attendance was 80%, exam fee was paid and hall ticket was issued for appearing any Semester exam, however could not appear for AITT in that semester for some uncontrollable reason, shall also be promoted to subsequent semester with approval of State Director of respective State. Such trainees shall appear for that semester exam during next Semester AITT, and will be given only three additional attempts instead of four, to pass the semester exam.

Subject: Modified All India Trade Test (AITT) Procedure and marking scheme for all trades of Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) under semester pattern

Sir/ Madam,

Your kind attention is invited to this office's letter of even number, vide which it was informed that the semester system has been implemented with effect from August, 2013 for all trades under Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS).

2. The examination procedure has been modified and detailed instructions regarding All India Trade Test (AITT) procedure under CTS are as under:

A. For Engineering trades:

- a) There will be a single objective type Examination paper for the subjects Engineering drawing and Workshop Calculation & Science.
- b) There will be a single objective type Examination paper for the subjects Trade Theory and Employability Skills.
- c) The two objective type Examination papers as mentioned above will be conducted by National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT), whereas examination for the subject Trade Practical will be conducted by the State Government. NCVT shall supply the Question Paper for the subject Trade Practical.

B. For Non-engineering trades:

- a) There will be a single objective type examination paper for the subjects Trade Theory and Employability Skills to be conducted by NCVT.
- b) The examination for the Trade Practical will be conducted by State Government but NCVT shall supply the Question Paper.

3. The marking pattern has also been modified and the distribution of marks for engineering and non-engineering trades under CTS as per semester system will be as under:

5. The following examination guidelines will be applicable to both Engineering as well as Non-Engineering Trades under CTS:

- a) It will be necessary for the candidates to secure a minimum of 40% Marks in each of these objective papers and minimum 25% marks in each part/ section of the objective type examination paper separately. In case, he/ she fails to do so, the trainee will move to next semester. One more attempt would be allowed to him/ her to clear the paper. In case the candidate fails to clear such a paper in next attempt also, such a candidate will not be allowed to study in the remaining semester(s).
- b) The minimum percentage required for passing Trade Practical shall be 60%. In case of failure, same procedure as in 'para a)' above will be followed.
- c) If a candidate who has failed to clear a particular examination paper despite two attempts shall be treated as Ex-trainee. If a candidate clears the objective papers as an Ex-trainee, he/she may take admission in next semester. The Ex-trainee may take admission in next semester in same or the other ITI depending on the availability of seats. A maximum number of four additional seats over and above the seats in each trade (including supernumeraries) may be filled by admitting the ex-trainees of the same ITI who have cleared the objective type examination papers.
- d) The question papers for Trade Practical shall be supplied by NCVT as per the existing procedure.
- e) A maximum number of two attempts will be given to clear the subject Trade Practical.

f) The course content (of allotted hours as 100 hours) for the subject "Employability Skills" will be divided semester-wise for the trade of duration one year (Two Semesters) and two years (Four Semesters). The allotted duration for the subject "Employability Skills" shall be 50 hours for the trades of duration 6 months (one semester). The details regarding this will be notified separately and incorporated in the syllabus of the subject "Employability Skills".

6. The modified examination procedure of AITT for all trades under Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) as above will be applicable with immediate effect. Accordingly, Directors of all the States and Union Territories dealing with Craftsmen Training Scheme are requested to issue further necessary instructions to all Government and Private ITIs of their respective State/UTs for smooth conduct of examination as per revised norms.
